Be sure to sign up for any of these extra days of quilting – Tuesdays and Thursdays of each week. If we could each put in an extra 2 or 3 hours minimum a week towards quilting the Star, we have a chance of finishing it for the Show. I hope you can help make this goal a reality. *Many hands make light work.* Details are on the program and signup sheets will be available.

Other Program Details




In Sympathy

We once again have had many visitors to our web page, http://quiltskingston.org/khq/. Between Jan 1 and Aug 18th, 16,357 people have visited our pages, averaging a little over 2000 visitors each month, up from 800 last year.

The statistics program says that over 73% of our visitors are from .com or for-profit companies. Our visitors continue to come from all over the world with 4% from Canada, 2% from Germany, and the rest with a few visitors from each of these countries: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Czech Republic, Chine, Denmark, Finland, France, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Japan, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Israel, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Malaysia, Norway, Poland, Romania, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingston, United States.
