## Remembering Marjorie

Kingston Heirloom Quilters' long time member Marjorie Fee passed way in mid- December, after a lengthy illness. She was one of the originals, a charter member who helped found this auspicious group. Marjorie was a leader and an encouraging mentor to the novices who often found our master projects intimidating. After Margaret Rhodes and Diane Berry discontinued their quiltmaking classes, she filled the gap by running similar classes out of her home. She also led the occasional workshop at Quilter's Choice fabric shop.

Marjorie was a talented needlewoman with an impeccable eye for colour. When working with her on the quilt "Margaret's Basket", I was eager to watch and learn as we shopped for the fabric. We found two equally suitable prints for the baskets. How to choose? She suggested we first select the background fabric. Once placed on the ivory backing the choice was clear, a subtle difference, but obvious to us both.

A prolific quiltmaker, she also made a series of seasonal banners for St. Margaret's United Church, two of which are now prominently displayed in the sanctuary of the amalgamated Crossroads United Church.

She had a quick wit and was a master of the sharp repartee, many of which found their way into the KHQ newsletters as punch lines for cartoons.

Though Marjorie had indicated to her family that she did not want a quilt draped across her coffin, there not being a coffin, her masterpiece was draped over the alter. After the service Diane Berry and I went up to have a closer look and were in awe at the amount of finely embroidered detail throughout the piece. It fittingly represented the talented woman, from whom we learned so much, and whose company we so enjoyed for nearly thirty years.

A treat from Gail Jennings – many people asked for this recipe in particular!

### Carrot-Orange-Yogurt Bars

1/3cup margarine or butter 1 1/4 cups flour 1 cup sugar ½ cup orange or plain yogurt 1 egg 1 t baking powder 1/4 t baking soda 3/4 cup finely shredded carrot 1 ½ t finely shredded orange peel 2 T orange or plain yogurt 1T margarine or butter 1 ½ to 1 2/3 cups sifted powdered sugar

- Grease a 9x9x2 inch baking pan; set aside. Beat the ½ cup margarine or butter in a large mixing bowl with an electric mixer on medium to high speed about 30 seconds or till softened.
- Add about half of the flour, the sugar, ½ cup yogurt, egg, baking powder, and baking soda to margarine. Beat till thoroughly combined, scraping sides of the bowl often. Beat or stir in remaining flour. Stir in carrot and ½ t of the orange peel.
- Spread batter into prepared baking pan. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes or till a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool in the pan on a wire rack.
- For frosting, in a small bowl beat the 2 T yogurt, 1 T margarine and remaining 1 t orange peel for 30 seconds. (Gail reduced the peel to ½ t.) Gradually beat in enough powdered sugar to make of spreading consistency. Spread over cooled cookie. Cut into bars. Store, covered in the refrigerator. Makes 24.

## Collecting Stories: The Heritage Quilt Collection

Agnes Etherington Art Centre, 29 January to 17 July, 2011 Tues, Wed, & Fri 10am – 4:30 pm, Thurs 10am – 9pm (free admission), Sat – Sun 1 – 5pm

Thirty years ago, three knowledgeable Kingston quilters, Margaret Rhodes, Diane Berry and Fran Crandall, approached the Agnes Etherington Art Centre with a unique proposal to preserve quilts of historical, regional and aesthetic significance for future generations. As a result, in 1981, the Heritage Quilt Collection was born. It was an opportune moment. In the 1970s, North America witnessed a revival of interest in quilts among scholars, artists, feminists, collectors and curators, not only as objects of continued traditions, but also as women's work and works of art. The Art Centre itself had a long-standing interest dating back to 1974, when renowned local artist Kim Ondaatje curated the quilt exhibition *Tradition+1*, which toured galleries across the country. Since that time, the quilt collection at the Art Centre has grown, and debates surrounding the place of quilts have been as rich and complex as quilting itself.

Collecting Stories showcases outstanding quilts from the 19th and 20th centuries and the stories that they tell of ingenuity, creativity, community and endurance. Whether originally intended for display in a home or public space, quilts were embraced by their makers as vehicles for self-expression to produce something visually stunning.

Collecting Stories will have a fresh change of quilts on 26 April, so be sure to return again in the spring to view a new display.


