A big thank you to all who supplied goodies for March and April and here are the recipes for two more favourites!

APRICOT TEA BREAD (Hilda)

³/₄ c dried apricots - soak in warm water for 30 minutes and then chop rind of ½ orange

1/3 c raisins

Sift together: 1 3/4 c flour

3/4 c sugar ¼ t baking soda

1 ½ t baking powder ½ t salt

Add the fruit to the sifted dry ingredients to coat, then make a well and add:

1 beaten egg

mixture of \(\frac{1}{4} \) c orange juice and \(\frac{1}{2} \) c boiling water

2 T vegetable oil or melted shortening

Bake in 9' x 5' loaf pan for 50-60 minutes @ 350 F.

BROWN SUGAR GINGER CRISPS

From Gourmet Magazine, October 1991 (Eleanor Clark)

1 cup unsalted butter at room temperature

1 cup firmly packed light brown sugar

1 large egg yolk

1 teaspoon vanilla

½ cup finely chopped crystallized ginger (can be bought at Tara's)

1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

3/4 teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon salt

In bowl cream together the butter and the brown sugar and beat in the egg yolk, the vanilla, the crystallized ginger, and the ground ginger. Into the bowl sift together the flour, the baking powder, and the salt and combine the batter well. Drop teaspoons of the batter about 3 inches apart onto ungreased baking sheets and bake the cookies in batches in the middle of a preheated 350 degree oven for 10 to 12 minutes, or until they are just golden. Let the cookies cool on the sheets for 5 minutes, transfer them carefully with a metal spatula to racks and let them cool completely. Makes about 50 cookies.

The weekend of April 27-28 found me in Hamilton for a wedding and a visit with my Mum. As a special treat for us both we went to the Halton Quilters Guild - "Quilts in the Gardens" at the RBG Centre of the Royal Botanical Gardens.. The venue worked quite well, although the main display area seemed crowded after the spacious curling club that we had for our last show. However it was a very good show with approximately 200 quilts, mostly machine quilted with a few hand quilted pieces. I recognized one quilt as being the same pattern as Simone's Woodland creatures.

He and his family have been collectors of early Canadian pieces such as furniture, pottery and textile art including quilts for over 50 years. He gave a short lively talk about his collection and the pieces on display.
