They were painted with many bright colours by students, and it looked to me like bright scraps sewn together to make a pleasing design.







During our long trip back to Kingston, we stopped in Vegreville, Alberta for a good look at the 'Vegreville Pysanka', the world's largest Ukrainian Easter Egg.

It is made of anodized aluminum, and the aluminum skin weighs 2000 lbs., the internal structure 3000 lbs., the base 27000 lbs., and it rotates in the wind.

It has: 524 star patterns

2208 triangular pieces 3512 visible facets 6978 nuts and bolts

Doesn't it remind you of quilting designs?


